

Clintonville

The Clintonville planning area is bound by Chase and Cemetery Roads to the north, Olentangy River to the west, Conrail Railroad to the east, and Glen Echo Ravine and Arcadia Avenue to the south. The area is home to 29,300 people with 6.5% of the population being children under age six. This is the fourth lowest percentage in Franklin County and is expected to grow slightly to 2020. Of the children under age six in the area, 9.4% are living below 125% of the Federal Poverty Level. This is well below the county average of 30%.

The availability of proximal and affordable child care is critical to the local economy as it enables parents and caregivers to work or further their education. Clintonville's potential child care demand exceeds the area supply. For children under age six, after adjusting for parental labor force status, this area's demand to supply ratio of 4.6 to 1 is more than double the Franklin County ratio of 2.1 to 1, and is the fourth highest in the county.

The average weekly costs of center-based child care are comparatively similar to that of the Franklin County average. There are two child care centers in Clintonville and one is accredited or quality rated.

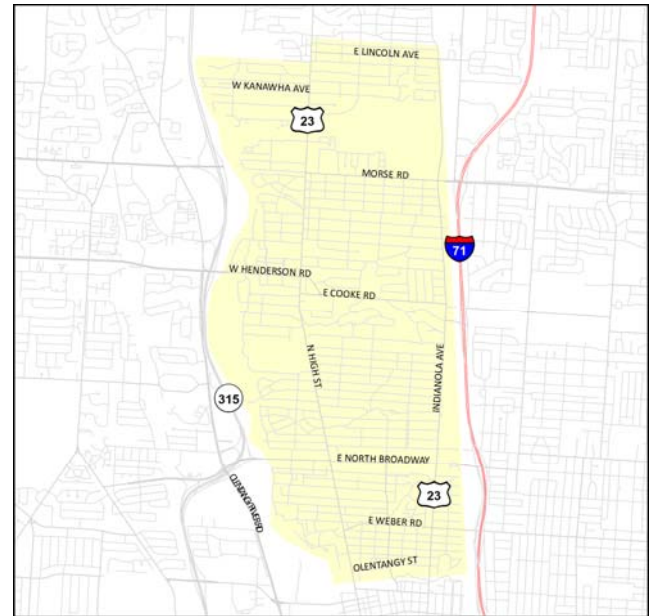

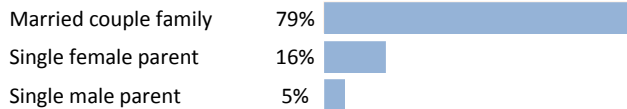

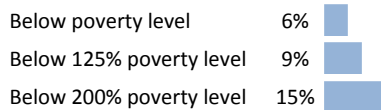
Characteristics of young children in the area

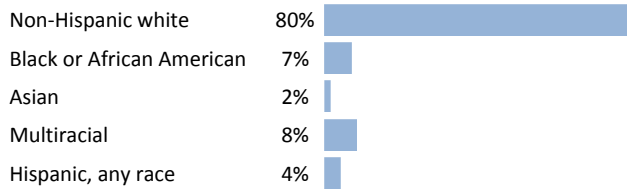
Family type for children under age 6



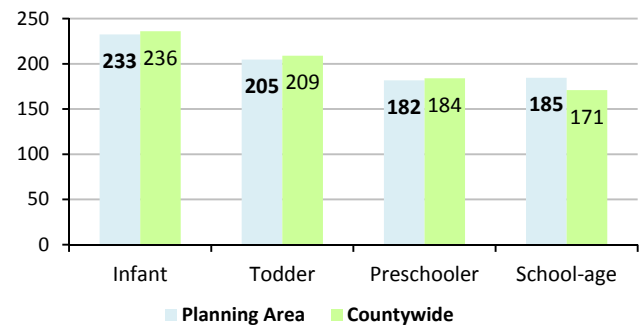
Household income for children under age 6



Race/ethnicity for children under age 5

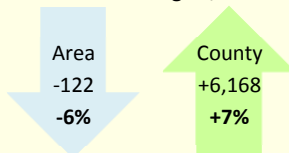


Average weekly cost of center-based child care (in \$)

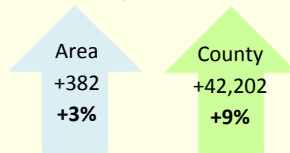


Population trend and household projection

Data sources and notes

Capacity data in this brief refer to child care providers registered with Action for Children or certified through Franklin County Job and Family Services.

- Action for Children NACRRRA database – capacity (August 2011) and slot-weighted average cost for center-based full-day, full-week care (2010)
- U.S. Census 2010 – potential demand by age level, family type, and race/ethnicity
- American Community Survey, 2005-2009 – income and parental labor force adjustment factor (children assumed in need of care only if all present parents in labor force)
- MORPC – household projections, 2010-2035 (extrapolated for 2020 by CRP)
- Ohio Department of Education – active public and private elementary schools (2012)
