Near East

The Near East area is made up of several historic neighborhoods, and located directly east of Downtown. It is bound by Conrail Railroad and I-670 to the north, Alum Creek to the east, I-70 and Livingston Avenue to the south, and I-71 to the west. The area is home to an estimated 17,900 people with 10.3% under the age of six. Additionally, the Near East has the second highest proportion of children living in single female parent households at 73%—more than double the countywide estimate of 28%. Of the children under age six, 72% are living in households below 125% of the Federal Poverty Level; also well above the countywide rate of 30%.

The availability of proximal and affordable child care is critical to the local economy as it enables parents and caregivers to work or further their


education. After adjusting for parental labor force status, the Near East and Hayden Run areas are the only two planning areas of the 27 to have a potential demand to supply ratio of 1 to 1 for children under age six.

The average weekly costs for center-based child care are lower in the Near East when compared to county averages, and there are only seven centers (of 18 total) which are accredited or quality rated.


