

"Science of Reading"

FOR AGES 0-5

Families can easily integrate the science of reading at home with children ages 0-5 through engaging and fun activities. Here are some practical strategies for different age groups.

0-2 Years

- 1. Read Aloud: Choose colorful, engaging board books.

 Use expressive voices and point to pictures to capture their attention.
- 2. Sing Songs and Nursery Rhymes: Use rhythm and repetition to develop phonemic awareness. Encourage clapping or actions to make it interactive.
- 3. Talk and Describe: Engage in conversations about everyday activities, describing what you see and do to build vocabulary.

2-3 Years

- 1. Play with Sounds: Use simple games to identify and manipulate sounds. For example, ask your child to find objects that start with the same sound as their name.
- 2. Introduce Letters: Use alphabet books and toys. Point out letters in everyday contexts, like signs or labels, and say their sounds.
- 3. Encourage Storytelling: Ask your child to tell you a story using pictures from a book or their imagination to build comprehension skills.



4-5 Years

1. Interactive Reading: Ask questions about the story while reading. Encourage your child to predict what will happen next or express their thoughts on the characters.

2. Phonics Activities: Engage in letter-sound games. Use flashcards or magnetic letters to match letters with pictures of objects that start with those sounds.

3. Repetition: Read favorite books multiple times. This builds fluency and helps children become more comfortable with the text.



General Tips

 Create a Reading Routine: Set aside specific times each day for reading and discussing books to make it a regular habit.

 Use Diverse Materials: Incorporate a variety of books, including fiction, non-fiction, and poetry, to expose children to different vocabulary and ideas.

 Encourage Writing: Provide materials like crayons, markers, and paper. Encourage scribbling and drawing, which are foundational for writing skills.

 Play-Based Learning: Incorporate literacy activities into play, like creating a "store" to practice writing lists or using puppets to act out stories.
